SOUSA: Stars and Stripes Forever Performances and comments feature resident musician William Chouinard playing a 1927 Casavant pipe organ now at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, Mantomedi, MN (www.standrews.org). This instrument, inaugurated by none other than Louis Vierne, was installed originally at Phillips-Andover Academy in Massachusetts. In the 1970s, P-A sold the Casavant and it went into storage. After nearly 25 years, it was rescued from limbo, given new wind chests and mechanism by the Schantz Organ Company (www.schantzorgan.com), with original pipework intact and unaltered, and it now enjoys its 'second coming' in a contemporary worship space designed specifically to
